The correct number for all of 2014 is stated above. The reason for the discrepancy was due to the fact that only veterinarian care was included. Upon receipt of this FOIA, dated March 15, 2016 this error was discovered. The correct amounts for the other years are as follows:

2012 – \$24,111.29

2013 - \$29,655.08

These numbers include veterinary care, food and supplies, and spaying and neutering for dogs and cats in the Center.
